HETTON-LE-HOLE is a town and parish, with a station on the Durham and Sunderland branch of the North Eastern railway, and is 255 miles by rail and 203 by road from London, 6 west from Seaham Harbour, 6½ east-north-east from Durham, and 8½ south-west from Sunderland, and in the Houghton-le-Spring division of the county, north division of Easington ward, Houghton-le-Spring union and petty sessional division, county court district of Durham, and in the rural deanery of Houghton-le-Spring and archdeaconry and diocese of Durham; the town is governed by an Urban District Council, formed by order of the Local Government Board, in March, 1895, under the provisions of the Act of 1894 (56 and 57 Vict. c. 73); it is lighted with gas by the Hetton Coal Co. Limited, and supplied with water by the Hetton-le-Hole and Easington Lane Water Co. Limited and with electric light by the Newcastle-on-Tyne Electric Supply Co. Limited. The Sunderland District Electric Tramway extends to this place. The ecclesiastical parish was formed July 27, 1838, by an Order in Council, out of the townships of Hetton-le-Hole and Great and Little Eppleton in the old parish of Houghton-le-Spring. The church of St. Nicholas, originally erected in 1822, was pulled down in 1898 and a new church erected at a cost of £5,400, and consecrated 29 April, 1901, by the Bishop of Durham: the font, of Caen stone, was given by the mothers of the parish: it is in the Early English style: a new organ was inserted in 1903 at a cost of about £800: five of the windows are stained: there are 800 sittings. The register books date from the year 1832. The living is a rectory, net yearly value £300, with residence, in the gift of the Bishop of Durham, and held since 1903 by the Rev. Frederick Smith M.A. of Corpus Christi College, Cambridge, and surrogate. There are Wesleyan, Primitive Methodist, Independent and United Methodist chapels, and Salvation Army hall. A cemetery of 3 acres was formed in 1891, north-west of the town, and is under the control of a joint committee of the Hetton Urban and the Houghton-le-Spring Rural District Councils. The Standard Theatre, in Park view, erected in 1871, is of red brick, and will seat about 300 persons. A Police Station, with two cells, was erected here in 1895. The Conservative Club, a structure of red brick in Station road, was erected in 1897 at a cost of £2,000, and comprises reading, billiard, committee, smoke and card rooms, a refreshment bar and rooms for the caretaker. The Miners' Hall, in Richard street, was erected in 1883, and will seat about 300 persons. The Masonic Hall was built in 1925 at a cost of about £700. The collieries in this parish,

EASINGTON LANE, or Lyons, is an ecclesiastical parish, formed from Houghton-le-Spring and Pittington parishes, February 16, 1869. For civil purposes this place is in the Urban District of Hetton-le-Hole, of which it forms a ward; it is three-quarters of a mile south from Letton station and 1½ west from South Hetton station, both on the North Eastern railway, 6½ miles from Durham and 8 from Sunderland; in the Houghton-le-Spring division of the county court district. The Sunderland District Electric Tramway was extended to this village in 1906. The church of St. Michael and All Angels is an edifice of stone, with freestone dressings, built at a cost of £4,000 and consecrated in 1870; it consists of chancel, nave of three bays, aisles and eouth porch: it was partly restored in 1906, at a cost of £1,500, when a new vestry was added, and now affords 500 sittings. The register dates from the year 1870. The living is a rectory, net yearly value £320, with residence, in the gift of the Crown and Bishop of Durham alternately, and held since 1909 by the Rev. William Laidlaw Monteith Law B.A. of Durham University. There is a church hall, Wesleyan and Primitive Methodist chapels, and a Christian Lay church, erected in 1884. A cemetery of 2 acres was formed in 1892, north-east of the parish, and is under the control of a joint committee of the Hetton Urban and the Houghton-le-Spring Rural District Councils. In this district is the Elemore Colliery,

belonging to the Hetton Coal Co. Limited. The ecclesiastical population in 1901 was 2,061.

EPPLETON (Hetton Downs) is an ecclesiastical parish, formed July 24, 1883, from the parish of Hetton-le-Hole. The church of All Saints, built in 1887 at a cost of £4,000, is an edifice of red brick with freestone facings, consisting of chancel, nave, aisles, large vestry, south porch and a western turret containing one bell; a new organ was erected in 1891 at a cost of over £400, and a carved oak screen was added in 1903 at a cost of £300; there are 750 sittings. The register dates from the year 1887. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £290, with residence, in the gift of the Crown and the Bishop of Durham alternately, and held since 1885 by the Rev. Robinson Hindle, of St. Bees. Here are Primitive Methodist and Wesleyan chapels. The Colliery Institute, in Downs lane, contains reading and billiard rooms and a library. The Church Institute, in George street, erected of iron in 1900, has also reading and billiard rooms. The population in 1901 was 5,226.
