Anthony Liddle Harrison

Was killed in a mining accident at Eppleton Colliery on 13th Dec 1895. He died by suffocation from gases while trying to rescue two work mates John Thomas Brown and Robert Lawns. The courage of the rescuers was commended in the Inspector's Report as below:

in 1860 a miner, in 1861 1871 1874 and 1881 a coal miner, d. ... [by 1897]

I should like here to say a word or two in appreciation of the courage and gallantry shown by the men who were amongst the rescuers. The three hewers, as well as the manager, under-manager, overman, and back-overman, all showed that they possessed the qualities which in the past made pitmen famous for heroism in the time of danger; such conduct as theirs should not go without commendation, and I am pleased to have the opportunity in this report, to show my appreciation of it, and I regret that one of them should have lost his life in the plucky attempt made to rescue Brown and Lawns.

Thomas avoided the mines by becoming an apprentice Joiner and Cabinet Maker to his maternal grandfather William Hill a former Mariner from Shields.

By the next census in 1891 the family was no longer living together, due to the death of both parents from TB. Some of them were living at 94 Richard Street with the McCutchion family. John the son was by then a 16 year old miner, his sister Alice and his aunt Mary were also living there. Anthony was living in Smith's Terrace, Easington Lane with his wife Margaret and 1 year old son John E, Anthony would die 4 years later in a pit accident, see left hand column.

In 1851 the Harrison's had 4 children from 1 to 16 yrs and were living at Moorsley.
