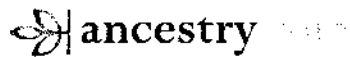

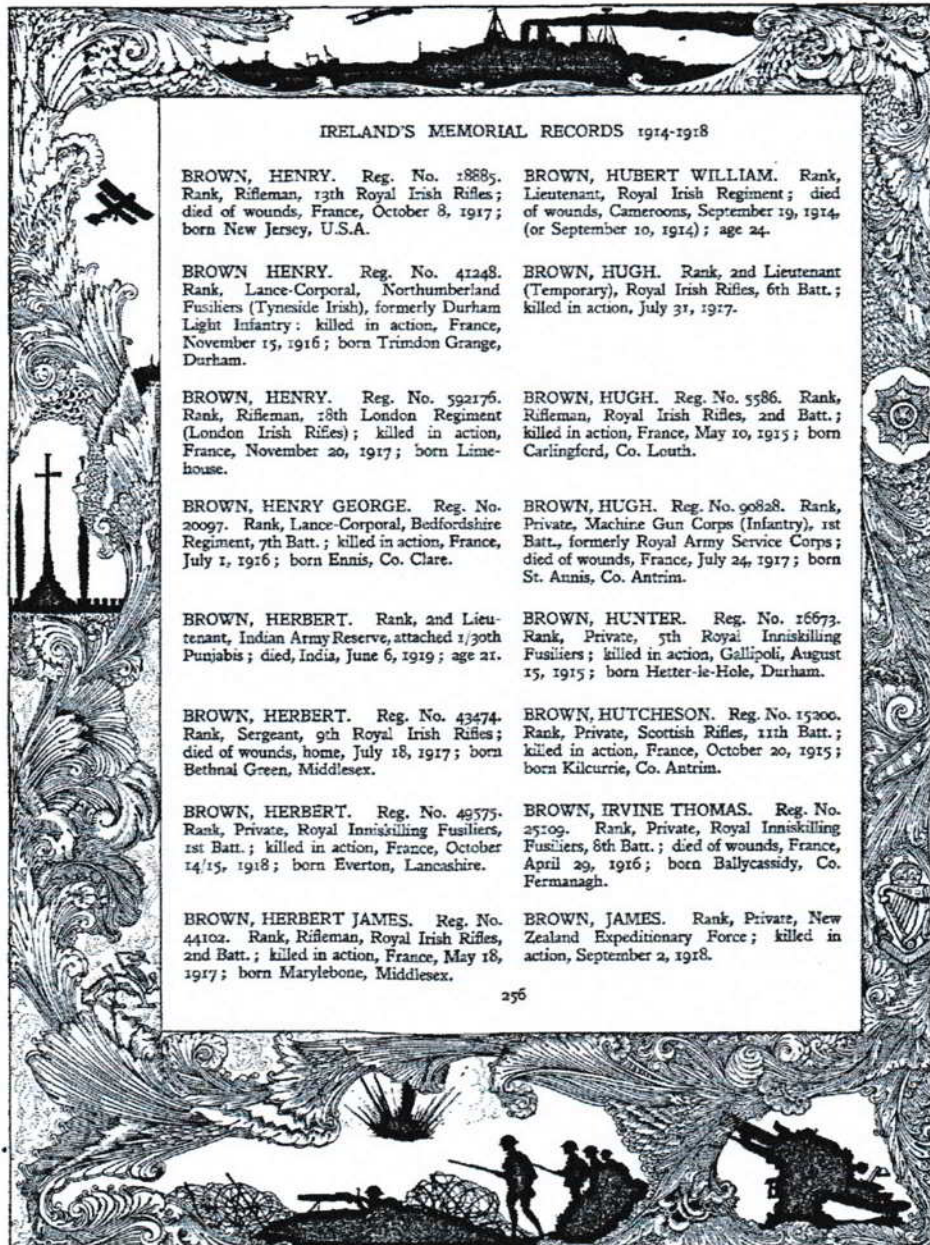

BROWN, HERBERT. Reg. No. 43474. Rank, Sergeant, 9th Royal Irish Rifles; died of wounds, home, July 18, 1917; born Bethnal Green, Middlesex.

BROWN, HERBERT. Reg. No. 49575. Rank, Private, Royal Inniskilling Fusiliers, 1st Batt.; killed in action, France, October 14/15, 1918; born Everton, Lancashire.

BROWN, HERBERT JAMES. Reg. No. 44102. Rank, Rifleman, Royal Irish Rifles, 2nd Batt.; killed in action, France, May 18, 1917; born Marylebone, Middlesex.

BROWN, HUBERT WILLIAM. Rank, Lieutenant, Royal Irish Regiment; died of wounds, Cameroons, September 19, 1914 (or September 10, 1914); age 24.

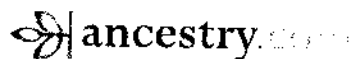

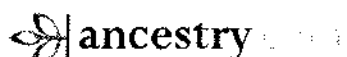
